In the meantime, in maths we have had a big focus on growth mindset and maintaining a positive attitude when working on problems we find difficult. This is also a great skill that can be transferred to many aspects in life and it would be fantastic if this could be further encouraged at home.

Year 4- Happy New Year! We hope you all had a lovely Christmas break. The children certainly seem to have enjoyed themselves. This week, we have been focusing on having a positive mindset and the benefits it can have for our learning. The children have certainly taken the advice on board and enjoyed challenging themselves and approaching tasks differently.

Our new topic is 'You've Been Framed' and we all enjoyed launching it with outdoor activities linked to the work of Andy Goldsworthy. We have also created our own colour wheels using primary colours to mix secondary and tertiary colours. In English, we are researching the lives of famous artists so that we can write our own biographies next week.

Year 5 & 6

A Happy New Year to one and all; we hope you are refreshed and looking forward to 2019! Our new topic, Vanishing Kingdom, was launched today. We have read the first two chapters of 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo and this be the stimulus for much of our English and topic teaching this term. The children enjoyed their orienteering activity as part of "yacht school", and this related to Michael's mother in the story who needed to develop her navigation skills before their world voyage.Our maths activities related to 'Inspirational Maths', generated by Jo Boaler of Stanford University who is a professor of mathematics. The sessions are open-ended, problem solving activities designed to engage and enthuse both children and their teachers. We also watch short video clips about cultivating a "growth mindset", which is the belief that with effort and perseverance, we can all improve our skills and abilities, not just in mathematics but in all school subjects and in wider life, too.

As part of our growth mindset work, we have started reading 'Mt Hidden Chimp' by Professor Steve Peters. We will continue using it and we would highly recommend the book. It helps primary age children and their parents better understand and manage their emotions thinking and behaviour.

Happy New Year to you all from everyone in year 6. We hope you enjoyed a relaxing break. Our new topic, The Vanishing Kingdom, began with a special themed day on the first day of this term. We read the opening chapters of our new book, Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo, and considered just exactly what it might be like to prepare for a long voyage on a yacht. We decided that navigational skills would be critically important, so we sent ourselves to "yacht school", just like Michael's mother in the story. Having learned how to read a map, we completed an orienteering course and earned our yacht master's certificate. Kensuke's Kingdom will continue to inspire and inform our English lessons and topic work over the coming weeks. In maths this week, we are once again following a week of inspirational maths activities provided by Professor Jo Boaler of Stanford University in the USA. These are open-ended, problem solving activities designed to engage and enthuse both children and their teachers. We also watch short video clips about cultivating a "growth mindset", which is the belief that with effort and perseverance, we can all improve our skills and abilities, not just in mathematics but in all school subjects and in wider life, too.
