We had a great first day back in Year 1, where we explored a box of artefacts from holidays in the past, we even found out that people used to wear swimming costumes made of wool. This week we had a visitor who told us all about holidays in the 1950s and 1960s. We had lots of interesting questions to ask. We hope you enjoyed receiving your hand-written letters last week.

We have enjoyed travelling back in time these last two weeks in Year 2! We were very surprised to learn that people 100 years ago did not go on holiday and that holidays in the 50s were only the most basic of affairs! We welcomed Mrs Mellersh (Miss Mellersh's mum!) to talk about her childhood holidays and we look forward to seeing your childhood holiday photos on Monday 26th June!

Year 3 & 4 - Veni, Vedi, Vici

In Year 3, a special delivery from the Tailor of Gloucester shop has ignited our English for this term. We received an array of Beatrix Potter books, information leaflets, DVDs and soft toys and the children have planned their English for this term, based on these resources. So far, we have written a letter back to the shop thanking them for their kindness, sketched Tailor of Gloucester book covers and this week, we are compiling a report/ author study on Beatrix Potter. We were also extremely fortunate to receive a visit from Chris Chatterton (a previous Mayor of Gloucester) who brought along a very unique embroidered waistcoat made for him on the anniversary of the Tailor of Gloucester story! This all links in with the next part of our Roman topic - the history of Gloucester and the hidden secrets our city holds!

We have made a great start to our final term together in Year 4 Cherry! In our topic, we have changed our focus from Glevum to modern day Gloucester. We have enjoyed celebrating the hard work and creativity shown by many children in their topic projects.

In English, we have started to explore the author Beatrix Potter and her locally based story 'The Taylor of Gloucester.' When you are out and about, please highlight any of the information displayed relating to Gloucester's history. There is a wealth of information on plaques and signs, particularly in parts of our city that are being re-developed.

In Maths we concluded our work with rounding numbers and using the inverse operation to check a calculation. Chris Chatterton, a previous Mayor of Gloucester, visited us and gave a fascinating insight into the role of Mayor and an overview of the rich history of our fine history. We have also been working with coordinates to construct polygons.

In Year 4 Oak class the children have embraced 'pars duo' (part two) of our Veni, vedi, vici topic. This term we zoom in on Glevum our home town of Gloucester and look at its importance in Roman civilization. We are proud to live in what was only one of four 'Colonia.' Look out what's underfoot as you walk around town; there are hints and clues everywhere that suggest Glevum was an important town. Ask your child what was once situated at Kingsholm rugby. Where did the Romans head to next?

In English we heard that a famous tale written by Beatrix Potter was set in Gloucester. We have found out about the author this week and look forward to hearing the story very soon.

Years 5 & 6 - Rumble in the Jungle/ The Battle for Middle England

Year 5 enjoyed a full day of Brain-teasing, spectacular science at the Cheltenham Science festival last week. From discovering the work of top spy agency, GCHQ, to building an aircraft under carriage with SAFRAN, to finding out how it feels to live with dementia, the discover zone enthralled us all. We enjoyed sampling the ice cream made by Olivia with the help of Dr Andrea Sella, a chemist at U.C.L whose Science show 'when is a gas not a gas?' blew the lids off a few bottles (literally!) and also blew our minds.

Up next for Science in Year 5: The GSP Science festival and also our visit to Severn Vale's forensic science morning. We really hope that we are inspiring our children to become the Scientists and Engineers of the future.

Year 6- What can we say? The residential was a resounding success and despite the somewhat soggy weather, we had a memorable and extremely fun time. From paddle boarding to climbing, to canoeing to low ropes, everyone achieved and everyone did so with a beaming smile upon their face.

We continue to work towards the end of the year with writing the top of our priority list. Rehearsal for Romeo and Juliet are underway and we hope to put on the show of a lifetime! Thank you to all our parents for supporting us in a manic end of the year.
