Reception

This week we have enjoyed looking at the book 'The Bear and the Piano' like the rest of the school. The piano in the playground was a great hit; we talked a lot about where it had come from. The piano in the story went 'plonk', this is a nice word to say, we made a list of other sound words and tried saying them in different ways and making up sentences with them in. (The balloon went pop.) There has been art going on to piano music, we have painted and found out about bears. It has also inspired us to do lots of writing.

Years 1 & 2

Year 1- What an exciting launch to book week! Year 1 loved meeting our visiting author David Lawrence Jones and even got the chance to work with him in a workshop to develop our own story ideas! We all felt very inspired by David and some of us even hope to grow up to be authors ourselves now! We have been getting stuck into our work on The Bear and the Piano as well, creating artwork, writing diaries and even trying our hand at scrap booking! We look forward to sharing what we have been up to with you in our writing gallery!

Year 2 - We have had a brilliant book week at school, hearing from David Lawrence Jones and studying the book The Bear and the Piano by David Litchfield. We look forward to seeing you at our Writers' Gallery on Friday 8th March to see the wonderful work we have produced this week!

Year 3 & 4

We have had a great start to the new term with some lovely sunshine and a fantastic book week! This week, Year 3 and the whole school took part in a book week, where we focused on the 'The Bear and The Piano' by David Litchfield. We have produced some wonderful pieces of work based around this book, such as, postcards, newspaper reports, concert posters and even finished the week with a class debate! On Monday we were lucky enough to have an exciting author visit by David Lawrence Jones, who also did a book signing for the children on Wednesday! The children have loved it and his books have proven very popular throughout the school. In maths this week we have been learning all about fractions and on Wednesday we had a go at making pizzas using fractions - I think it's safe to say we all had a lot of fun! Next week the children find out what our new topic is and we can't wait!

We have had a busy and exciting week in Year 4. It began with a visit from the author, David Lawrence Jones, on Monday which kick-started our book week. We enjoyed the workshop with David on Monday afternoon as we were able to create comic strips that featured our own hero and villain characters. We have also enjoyed reading The Bear and the Piano and the children have been researching bears and their habitats. We have enjoyed writing different texts and hope you can come and share them with us next Friday.

In PE we enjoyed a great cricket session in the sun with cricket coach, Tim Knibbs. The activities allowed us to improve our skills, especially throwing and catching.

Year 5 & 6

We have really enjoyed our book week and as a school, we have all been investigating 'The Bear and the Piano'. This stimulus has enabled us to write a formal letter and music review which we look forward to sharing with you later this term. As a whole school, we very much enjoyed meeting David Lawrence Jones, a well-known author who inspired us with our reading and writing. In the afternoon, we collaborated with Year Four to invent our own hero and villain for a comic strip. We have completed our work based on 'Kensuke's Kingdom', which the children thoroughly enjoyed.

We are continuing our work on percentages, decimals and fractions. As a class, most children have enjoyed developing their times tables and division skills using Times Table Rockstars, https://ttrockstars.com/login. Please let us know if you have had problems accessing the site.

On Wednesday, we worked with Tim Knibbs to build on our cricket skills. Later this year, we will celebrate the Cricket World Cup within the school

At the end of last term, we enjoyed finishing our book, Kensuke's Kingdom. It has proved a rich source of inspiration for many forms of writing and also for our art work. We do like Michael Morpurgo as an author. This week is book week at Meadowside and all classes are studying the book The Bear and the Piano. Far from being only a book for young children, this beautifully illustrated story tackles many profound themes and dilemmas of the modern age. We are using it to stimulate debate and encourage writing for a range of purposes. In maths, we have begun our revision sessions in preparation for standard assessments in May. It is useful for all of us to have the opportunity to discuss strategies both for calculation and problem solving. Our topic work continues, with studies of the work of the artist Henri Rousseau and more science relating to classification of animals and plants, adaptations of living organisms and reproduction in plants
