Meadowside Class News.

Reception -

It has been great to get to know all our new members of the Meadowside family over the last few days. All the children have made a great start to school. In the classroom everyone is confident with the routines and we have all enjoyed playtimes with the rest of the school. Some of us did PE for the first time this week and the other group used the ICT suite. By the time we are all in together we will have done lots of new things. Our topic is 'Who are we' and we are getting to know each other, talking about how we are the same and different. Soon we will be talking about lots of our favourite things; sharing our favourite books and talking about our favourite food.

Years 1 & 2 - Escape from Treasure Island

What an exciting day we had in year one on Monday! We found ourselves stranded on a desert island with nothing but a mysterious locked box and a bag of scrolls! We followed the instructions from the main scroll which told us more boxes were waiting for us but we didn't know where to find them! We had to solve some riddles as a team which led us to more boxes and puzzle pieces. When we put the pieces together we found the combination to the first box. Inside was some treasure and a question we have to solve in order to open the next box. We can't wait to learn more information so we can discover what lies in our other boxes!

Year 2 have started the year with great enthusiasm and we are ready and set for the challenges that lie ahead- we like challenges, we have decided! This week, we discovered that we have been stranded on a Desert Island for our topic Escape from Treasure Island. We have been set a series of Key Questions that we will need to answer in order to unlock a set of treasure chests and escape... can we complete the tasks to escape?! Keep a look out for our maths, English and topic letters coming out this week!

Year 3 & 4 - Really Revolting

Year 3 have got off to a really revolting start this term with slimy snail poetry, gross-o-meters and eating worms - goodness knows what will happen next week! The children all looked 'dahlicious' in their Roald Dahl inspired costumes and we must thank you for your support in helping making this special day as fun as it was! Year 3 have also started High 5 netball skills in PE and have begun to create revolting computer animations using Scratch. The children are encouraged to bring warm clothes for outdoor PE this term (joggers/jumpers/leggings etc...)

We have had an exciting start to Year 4 and the children have enjoyed being REALLY REVOLTING! After a fantastic topic launch last week, we have spent time delving into revolting substances and trying to work out what they were using only the sense of touch. Baked beans, pasta, porridge and shaving foam led to us pulling some very funny faces!

We have been reading Roald Dahl's Revolting Rhymes and Wednesday was lots of fun as we celebrated Roald Dahl Day. The children all looked fantastic dressed as their favourite character from his books and we created a bar graph to show the book which generated the most costumes. In maths, we have been finding out about the brain and how much it grows, even when we make mistakes. We have looked at how creative it can be and were surprised by the number of different ways people approach solving the same task. We have created graphs, looked at how patterns grow and discovered that there are different ways to get to answers.

Years 5 & 6 - Mission Mars

Cherry class have made an excellent start to the year, showing their enthusiasm for learning as they begin their journey into space on Mission: Mars! So far, they have applied for the post of child astronaut on a forthcoming N.A.S.A. mission to Mars and eagerly await a reply. A study of the solar system has inspired us to create our own papier mache planets and we've also used tie-dye techniques to create a fabric "sun". In maths, we are very busy learning more about multiplication including multiples, factors and primes. Soon we shall be studying various theories about how the universe began in our science lessons. Swimming lessons will have begun by the time you read this newsletter and Cherries will also have commenced playing tag rugby in their games lesson.

In Oak class we have enjoyed a great start to the year and the children have begun to consider life outside of planet Earth in our new topic Mission: Mars! We have started to learn the names and order of planets and how different they are to our own; why not ask your child why Pluto is no longer considered a planet?

In English, we have being exploring the use of metaphor and simile in poetry and in maths we been consolidating our multiplication skills. This term, we will be working outdoors in a Tag Rugby p.e. unit and we would ask that you ensure that your child is prepared for all weathers that we may encounter at this time of year! Swimming also started this week. Thank you for the books that have been donated to our classroom bookcases, rest assured, other children will enjoy reading them too!

We look forward to seeing you at the Year 5 Parents' event next Wednesday and at Parents' evening.

YEAR 6- What an amazing start to our new school year! We have launched Mission Mars successfully as our new topic and we look forward to some intergalactic fun along the way. We have written our very own applications to be an astronaut, excited about the space mission advertised. We have used our artistic and creative skills also to create some tie-dyed suns and children have had input about where they would like to take their learning journey next. Nestled beautifully amongst our classroom based learning, we successfully managed very wet and tiring adventure on Monday to Croft Farm Water Park. We rowed a katacanu down the River Avon, battling what felt like all seasons in one day! We also built and tested our own rafts in the lake. This really was team-building at its best. We saw incredible resilience from all members of the class and many shocked themselves at what an incredible 'can do' attitude can bring to their own personal development. Plenty more of this will see year 6 as a wonderful way continue their Meadowside journey. Let's make memories.
