Year 1 End of Year Expectations

These are the end of year expectations for your child's current year group. If they achieve these they will meet the Expected Standard in July.

Remember, these are an indicator to aim for, but every child learns at their own pace. Their effort, determination and the steps of progress they make are equally valued by the Team at Meadowside.

Personal, Social & Health Education and Citizenship

- Shows an understanding of what is right and wrong
- Knows key elements of keeping fit, healthy and safe
- Appreciates the needs and views of others
- Confident to share their opinions
- Participates well in school life and shows an awareness of belonging to different groups and communities



English

Speaking and Listening, Reading, Writing (includes Spelling, Punctuation and grammar)

Spoken language

- Speak audibly and fluently with an increasing command of spoken English
- Select and use appropriate tone and vocabulary for effective communication

Reading

- Says the correct sound for all of the 40 plus graphemes learnt in Year One, including alternative pronunciations
- Reads aloud using their developing phonic knowledge including words using suffixes or words with more than one syllable
- Uses blending accurately to read unfamiliar words including words with contractions and apostrophes
- Reads common exception words with speed and accuracy
- Checks that the text makes sense as they read
- Knows some key stories retelling them and discussing their particular features
- Predicts what might happen on the basis of what is being said and done



Writing

- Composes their sentence before writing
- Begins to sequence own sentences to form a short narrative
- Re-reads what they have written to check it makes sense
- Punctuates sentences using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops or question marks/exclamation marks where necessary
- Uses capital letters for names of people, places, days of the week and the personal pronoun "I"
- Forms lower case letters, capital letters and the digits 0 to 9 in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place
- Applies their phonic knowledge



Mathematics

Number, Measurement, Geometry, Statistics

- Can count to 100 and backwards from 100 from any given number
- Can count from 0 in multiples of 2 (up to 24), 5 (up to 60) and 10 (up to 120)
- Can add and subtract a two-digit and a one-digit number up to 20
- Writes addition and subtraction statements using "+", "-", and "=" up to 50
- Solves one-step multiplication problems using multiples of 2, 5, and 10 using concrete objects
- Recognises and uses language referring to dates, including weeks, months and years
- Tells the time to the hour and half past the hour, using an analogue clock
- Recognise and name the fraction $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ of an object, shape or quantity
