#### Personal, Social & Health Education and Citizenship

- Shows an understanding of what is right and wrong
- Knows key elements of keeping fit, healthy and safe
- Appreciates the needs and views of others
- Confident to share their opinions
- Participates well in school life and shows an awareness of belonging to different groups and communities



## English

# Speaking and Listening, Reading, Writing (includes Spelling, Punctuation and grammar)

#### Spoken language

- Speak audibly and fluently with an increasing command of spoken English
- Select and use appropriate tone and vocabulary for effective communication

# Reading

- Retell a wide variety of stories
- Ask and answer questions to improve their understanding of a text
- Identify main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph
- Make comments showing inference based on evidence from a text
- Explain possible reasons for a writer's choice of language



#### Writing

- Use plural and possessive apostrophes accurately in independent work
- Consistent use of paragraphs to organise writing around a theme
- In Non-narrative material use simple organisational devices, e.g. headings, sub headings
- Proof read own work for spelling and punctuation errors
- Use inverted commas to indicate direct speech accurately
- Demonstrate correct use of commas after fronted adverbial phrases
- Correct use of a wide variety of tenses, past, present and perfect
- Use a wide range of conjunctions
- Write legibly with consistent letter formation and joins



## Mathematics Number, Measurement, Geometry, Statistics

- Round a number to nearest 10, 100, or 1,000 and a number with 1 decimal place to nearest whole number
- Use columnar addition and subtraction with up to 4 digits
- Multiply 3-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers, using short method
- Use formal written methods, when appropriate, to solve 2 step problems
- Recall multiplication and division facts for all tables up to 12x12. Use known and derived facts to multiply and divide mentally
- Add and subtract fractions with the same denominator
- Recognise equivalent fractions
- Calculate the area and perimeter of rectilinear shapes
- Interpret and present data in bar charts and time graphs
- Solve problems by applying their mathematical skills, including breaking down problems into simpler steps and persevering in seeking solutions
- Reason mathematically including developing an argument, justification or proof using mathematical language
