## Message from the Head

A lot has happened since our last edition! The Inspection process this week involved many hours of preparation on Tuesday, followed by two very busy and intense days with our Lead Inspector. ## Meadowside Class News

I've given class teams a week off from their news updates. Instead, I'm going to give you a flavour of each class's learning, having spent plenty of time with everyone over the last 2 weeks!

In Reception Class, the children have enjoyed 'The Gingerbread Man' this week, with themed activities including a puppet theatre, cooking and story mapping. Last week, they also recreated a Victorian school room complete with chalk board and strict schoolmistress, who made Miss Thomas sit out at the front of class, for disobedience! They looked wonderful in their outfits too!

Year 1 and 2 showed off their Geography, phonics and reading skills for the Lead Inspector, who was most impressed by their attitudes. This week, they have experienced bucket chains first-hand, to understand more about how the Great Fire of London was extinguished. Today, several grand Tudor houses were burnt to a cinder on the amphitheatre – a memorable learning experience!

Years 3 and 4 generated an impressive list of Victorian words and phrases gleaned from their immersion into Oliver Twist's world. They were able to define and use these in their own writing accurately. Year 3s sang me a rendition of Food Glorious Food. When I quizzed them about some of the lyrics, they were able to explain them perfectly! I'm afraid that Mrs Whitlock has taught Year 4 how to pick pockets expertly – watch out, you have been warned! Both classes have been creating volcanoes this week to extend their geographical understanding. We are anticipating eruptions imminently!

Years 5 and 6 impressively demonstrated to visitors the accumulation of their knowledge and skill. Whether talking about reading, mathematics or topic work, their enthusiasm for learning shone through! Teamwork and problem-solving were needed, to recreate mechanical Trojan horses and plenty of technical vocabulary was on show, to describe and demonstrate these in action.
