Dear Parents and Carers,

As you will be aware, the Government has updated its Coronavirus guidance, as announced in Tuesday's news. This guidance contains the following information :

"Based on current evidence, the main symptoms of COVID-19 are a cough, a high temperature and, in severe cases, shortness of breath.

The exact response to COVID-19 will be tailored to the nature, scale and location of the threat in the UK, as our understanding of this [virus] develops."

As a school, the safety, health and well-being of our students and staff is our top priority. We appreciate that parents and guardians may have questions about the Novel Coronavirus and how this will be managed in schools.

We will be receiving daily updates from the Department for Education as of today, to keep us updated on the governments' response to COVID-19 (Coronavirus). The most recent email has the following information:

Today we spoke to all children in an assembly to reiterate the importance of good hygiene and handwashing in preventing the spread of the disease, as set out in the Delay Phase of the Government's action plan. We have purchased extra soap dispensers and soaps for key areas of school and have posted key information up around school to remind children of these important messages.

The latest advice from NHS Direct is

- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately
- wash your hands with soap and water often use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available. Sing Happy Birthday twice while washing, to make sure you have taken enough time on the task.
- try to avoid close contact with people who are unwell

You should not be unduly worried about the possibility of your children catching the Coronavirus.

There is no reason why your children should not continue to attend their early years, school or further education setting as normal.
