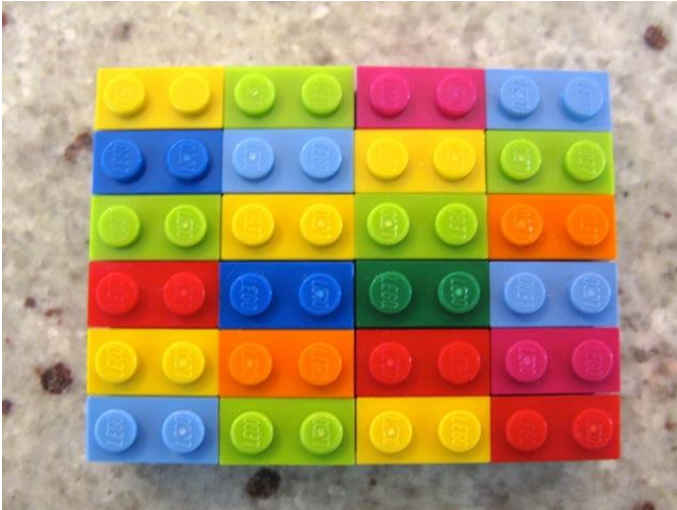

English from the Book of Hopes	This week's text from The Book of Hopes has some tricky language in it, so use this Oak Academy lesson to help you remember how to work out what a word means in a text. Miss Emms reminds you to re read the text and imagine what is happening!	Use the tricks you practised with Miss Emms yesterday to answer the questions about these Four Stories in the First News Newspaper. There are questions about text 1 and 2 and the vocabulary they use. What new words have you learnt?	Now read the text A New Sun Up. It uses some very unusual noun phrases like: tiny-new-guy sun-up team members triangle house made of cloth places that had food and drink Work out what he means by each of those descriptions.	Use what you discovered and deduced and write a mini dog to human dictionary! Write each dog phrase, then write a sentence to explain what this means in human language! You could even turn it into an illustrated dictionary and add pictures!	There are many stories that use animals as characters, but not many that use animal -language to describe what they see! One of my favourites is Wolf Brother by Michelle Pavers. Listen to this extract of Chapter 3 and try and work out what the wolf cub is describing. STOP at 5mins 25 secs , then listen on to find out if you were right!
Maths	Hopefully you used the Wednesday session last week to practise as today's lesson is the last recap lesson- Consolidating adding and subtracting	Who remembers arrays?!! We learnt about arrays just before lockdown- they help us with multiplication. Mrs Crane uses arrays and counting in 3s to help us count sets of counters/ beads. Try it!	Today's lesson uses the array method and the counting method like yesterday... but this time use counting in 4s! Recall the 4 times table!	Use Arrays to solve x3 and x4 equations! Mrs Crane reminds you how to use arrays	Arrays are everywhere! Hunt around your house and local area, trying to find real life versions of arrays- use them to find out how many of those things there are altogether without counting! Chocolate and Lego is great for this! Send me photos of what you find! See mine below!
