Meadowside Class News

Reception - Cherry class

A very energetic launch to our topic (Where shall we go? How do we get there?) involved scooting and cycling all around the playground. The children loved showing their friends their bikes and scooters and demonstrating their riding skills. During the session we managed to ask several of the questions that the children had generated in their planning session. Other questions have been tricker to answer, for example how do you make a road? Luckily the BBC have come to the rescue and Maddie's do you know? series has proved invaluable for explaining this and several other questions. This week we have asked how do you travel through the air. Apart from making hot air balloons for our Mini Mes we have had fun with paper planes and talked about going on a plane. We have planned our packing and looked at Atlases to try and comprehend just how big the world is and where we could go. In Maths we have been sharing fairly into equal groups and looking at odd and even numbers.

Year 1 - Oak Class

Year 1 have had a very busy start to term 6! We have been learning all about some other famous voyages from history including those of Christopher Columbus and Sir Francis Drake. We have been analysing how history sometimes doesn't tell us the whole story and some of us have even come to think that perhaps Sir Francis Drake may have been a pirate! By the time you read this, we will have done some pirate food tasting – ask your child if there was anything they liked (or didn't like!) and why pirate food wasn't necessarily the best!

In maths we have been learning all about money. We have started with the main coins under £1 and have been recognising them and solving problems. Next week, we will learn more about pounds and notes. This is a really important life skill to work on at home with children, thank you to those of you who have been doing the money skills Learning with Parents topics – it has made a real difference!

In English we have focused a lot on reading in the last week and have now begun a new mystery class book! We know it features a girl, a crocodile and a treasure map but this is all we have so far! We have started to create plans for finding gold and even drawn our own treasure maps!

Year 2 - Beech Class

Year 2 were very excited to learn that our planned holiday will be a traditional 1900s holiday- a day trip to our local beach Weston super Mare! We have been learning all about holidays from this era as we try to

answer Key Question 5- **How (and why) have holidays changed over the past 100 years?** We were stunned to find out that many people didn't go on holiday AT ALL and even if you did, it was just a day trip. How lucky we are to be able to afford many more trips than this nowadays! Please note that if you have not yet paid for this trip, payments are now overdue.

We will be studying 3 eras over the rest of our topic- 1900-1930, 1930-1970 and 1970-2000 and these will be the basis of our English lessons as we create 3 reports in our topic books- one for each era studied. We will be looking at the following aspects and comparing the eras with each other and nowadays- destination, accommodation, transportation, entertainment and clothing. We will be putting our historical skills to good use as we discuss the changes we notice.

Our maths work this term will be a culmination of everything we have learnt in Year 2! We have been practising all four operations and this week are focusing closely on fractions. Times tables and number bonds are the foundations of these and help with solving a variety of different areas of maths, so please help your child to learn these. Use TTRockstars and Numbots as fun ways to practise (and earn a house point each week too!)

Year 3

We have had a great start to the final term of the year! We started with the launch of our new topic - 'Tomb Raiders'- during this topic we will be learning about Ancient Egypt and making links with our previous learning about prehistoric Britain. We have compared the eras on a timeline and learnt about where Egypt is. We have also thought about how we know so much about life in Ancient Egypt.

In Maths we have been learning to tell the time on analogue clocks to the nearest minute. This is a skill that is quite tricky. Please help your child by regularly asking them what the time is!

In English, we have been looking at a variety of Cinderella stories from around the world, looking for similarities and differences. This week we have been looking at the story of the Egyptian Cinderella, thinking about the different characters in the story. We look forward to reading more of the story!

Year 4 - Willow Class

Year 4 enjoyed a musical start to our new topic 'Let Me Entertain You' when they split into groups to write their own song based on the story of the three little pigs. All children were brave enough to perform in front of the class and Mrs Whitlock, who chose two winning groups! In our topic, we have been learning about how sound travels by discussing vibrations and air particles and have begun looking at how we can change sounds. We did an experiment to see how differing amounts of water in a glass changed their pitch when hit with a beater. We have also begun to look at the CAMs mechanism in DT in preparation for making toys later in the term. In English this week, we have been writing a recount all about our time on the residential, which we will be sharing with you all soon! The children have made huge improvements in their writing. In maths, we have been looking at fraction and decimals equivalents. Our ukulele lessons are also coming along well; we have learned 4 notes now! The children all did fantastically in their Times Tables Check this week and should be exceptionally proud of themselves! A restful weekend is in order!

Year 5 – Maple Class

Year 5 have enjoyed being scientists the last couple of weeks and undertaking some investigations in class. They have been finding out which materials are magnetic, conductors or insulators. We set up an electrical circuit to see which materials let electricity flow through it to light a bulb and which did not. They tested a range of objects: a coin, blu-tak, rubber band, brick, lego brick, tin foil, brick, ruler and a pencil. They made predictions, collected and recorded results in a table and wrote conclusions to explain their outcomes. Another experiment involved thermal conductivity and identifying which drinking vessel kept the heat in the longest. We collected data by taking the temperature of hot water from four different drink

cups with lids (plastic, glass, ceramic and metal) every five minutes for thirty minutes. The children found that the metal drinking cup held the heat the longest! They presented their findings using a line graph.

In English, the children have been learning how to write a discussion text. They have explored the features of a balanced argument and have answered the question: Should dogs be kept on leads in parks? They have used formal language and structured their writing using a clear introduction, paragraph for the argument, paragraph against the argument and a conclusion. Next week, the children will apply their understanding of writing a discussion to write about whether Banksy is an artist or a criminal!

In maths, the children have explored how to calculate the area of rectangles and squares and investigated how to find a perfect rectangle!

Year 6 - Yew Class

Wow! What a start to our final term the residential was! It was a fantastic time filled with smiles, laughter, can-do attitudes and memories to last a lifetime. We could not have asked for more from the children and the adults came away feeling incredibly proud. Year 6 showed that they are ASPIRATIONAL, INDEPENDENT and OPPORTUNISTIC in a range of ways over the course of the three days-nobody was ready to come home! This week we returned to normal school life with a hilarious English writing unit-negative Trip Advisor reviews. Look out for these when your child brings their work home at the end of the year as they are sure to provide you with a laugh! In maths we have been problem solving and tackling times tables beyond the 12 x table, using mental methods. We also had our fist RSE lesson where we focused on the reproductive body parts of humans. We managed to squeeze in some script reading too this week, although we do ask that children please learn their lines at home so that we can get started with the fun bit- the acting! Our final topic (Dreams and Aspirations) is about reflecting on how far we have come and where we want to go in the future. We have looked at inspiring stories of young people who have achieved great things, and started to talk about what we want to achieve in our own lives. Let's make this final term a special one!

Although we did not win any of the matches we took part in, the team were absolute star players. It was a fantastic opportunity; they worked well as a team, we saw some fantastic hits and fabulous fielding. They were even true sportsmen by soldiering on through the rain! Great fun was had by all and they should be extremely proud of themselves!

Hopefully you have now seen your invitation to our reading event on Wednesday 18th June! We love reading at Meadowside and know that it has huge benefits in terms of developing children's understanding of the world, broadening their horizons and helping them feel happy and content by taking time to relax with a good book. Story time is often our favourite bit of the day and the English Team would like to invite you to a huge 'story time' - our Reading Afternoon Parent Event which will take place around the school on <u>Wednesday 18th June from 3.30-4.15pm</u>.

In a busy world, we know that it is becoming more difficult to make time for this precious part of the day so the aim of the event is to demonstrate to you some ways that you can easily build reading into your daily life and allow you and your child to make positive links to snuggling down and getting lost in a good book. Children from some of our classes will show you how they use stories and reading opportunities to enhance their learning across the curriculum and all the different ways that reading can be enjoyed.
